- Lyndsay Cameron- Principal Architect- University Architect. Department has recently changed structure. Capital Planning & Development oversees 1) Capital Projects Office, 2) Office of the University Architect, 3) UW Real Estate. Lindsey will be point person for Capital Planning and Development.
- Claudia Frere-Anderson- Director, UW Sustainability- Came on when UW Sustainability started. Provides administrative support that committee needs.
- Chris Toman- Sustainability Programs Specialist, UW Sustainability- Evans alumnus, Mentor:
 - Natalie Gray- Senior, Environmental Science and Resource Management major. Was on the CSF Committee for two years, was the Vice Chair last year, and will take on a mentorship role this year.

<u>Climate Action Plan Presentation- UW Sustainability</u>

- UW Sustainability was established to support Climate Action Plan, which is a living, breathing document. UW Sustainability acts like a connector between many units.
- Goal of reducing GHG emissions (towards carbon neutrality)
- UW Sustainability gathers information from campus departments and units (e.g. facilities) and submits data to organizations who rank university sustainability efforts (e.g. AASHE, Stars, Sierra Club)
- Sustainability dashboard to shows CAP progress
- Engage in behavior change communications and promotion to demonstrate commitment by UW
- Environmental Stewardship Committee (ESC) reports to president, provost about policy changes (chaired by Lisa Gramlich)

<u>CSF Appointment to the Environmental Stewardship Committee</u>

- ESC is a campus wide committee that meets 6 times a year to help strategize and guide sustainability efforts on campus
- The CSF appointee to ESC would provide general support, attend ESC meetings 6 times a year, relay pertinent information and updates RE: CSF.
- Not a voting position, but you would help shape and guide campus policy. Top priorities ESC is working on: 1) Virtual Servers, 2) Power plant conversion from steam to hot water, 3) lab efficiency.

Chair and Vice Chair nominations

- Colin nominated himself for Chair. Cited previous experience with CSF, his work with the budget sub-committee, and previous project involvement.
- Carolyn nominated herself for Vice Chair. Cited previous experience with CSF, work with budget subcommittee, experience with the NW Women at UW and SEED.
- MOTION: Elect Colin Butler as 2015-2016 CSF Committee Chair

- MOTION: Elect Carolyn Hartman as 2015-2016 CSF Committee Vice Chair
