I am writing to confirm Othello-UW Commons' support for the Lil Labs Climate Resilience South Seattle project and their application for the Resilience and Compassion Seed Grants.

I currently serve as the Assistant Director of the Othello-UW Commons (OUWC). The OUWC is a learning and collaboration space for faculty, staff, students and community partners situated right next to the Othello Light Rail station. Conversations with local residents inform our programming priorities year to year as we aim to support Southeast Seattle's vision of sustaining an equitable, inclusive, and welcoming community.

Oftentimes the only opportunities for interacting with the University of Washington are school field trips, speaker series, or through other events that take place on campus. The Lil Labs project will create opportunities for the Othello neighborhood and Rainier Valley community to engage with the UW in a different way.
