## **Background**

Last year, with the help of a coalition of sustainability and business organizations, we launched the second <u>Climate Solutions Summit</u>. The event explored scaling and implementing distributed solar in underserved communities locally and nationwide in the wake of the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA).

The centerpiece was a cross-disciplinary conference that connected enthusiastic students with clean energy professionals. The conference featured a keynote speech from Governor Bob Ferguson and panel discussions on Disruptive Innovation and Community Solar.

The second element was a community solar case competition. Sixteen student teams learned about the IRA's policy incentives and proposed solutions to increase the speed and scale of distributed solar projects in opportunity zones, including tribal constituencies. Teams presented their ideas to expert judges, and the top teams competed in a final round for cash prizes.

# Case Competition: Saturday, May 3rd, 2025

The case charge will task student teams to develop recommendations for a local organization to improve its sustainability initiatives through promoting gender equity and intersectionality.

Like last year, teams will present their ideas to expert judges, and the top teams will compete in a final round for cash prizes. Most importantly, the student-generated strategies will be available to relevant stakeholders with the goal of real-world implementation.
