Emails and attendance (Tatiana):

• Email etiquettes: everyone should RSVP (yes/no) to meeting invites and send an email if they cannot attend a particular meeting.

- The committee decided that email is the preferred primary mode of communication with additional communication (announcements) via slack
- There will be performance reviews at the end of each quarter, excluding this quarter

Payments (Kyle):

- The workday email to add hours should be ignored
- All committee members should see a payment of \$440 on December 10th, 2022
 - Those who have direct deposit set up will get the funds directly to their account
 - Those who do not have direct deposit set up will receive a check
- The vice chair role will be revamped, with the VC contributing 3.5 hours per week. The chair will contribute 5 hours and the committee members will contribute 2 hours/week.

WOHESC: Washington and Oregon Higher Education Sustainability Conference:

- The conference will take place in Oregon State University (Corvallis) from March 6-8
- There will be two days of programming, involving keynote speakers who are experts on the topic, and sessions by faculty and students on their initiatives related to sustainability
- Will present on applying a just transition framework to the Campus Sustainability Fund
- If someone from the committee wants to join and present, CSF will cover all (?) costs
- CSF Committee WOHESC Interest Form should be filled up by December 21st. Decisions will be made from an equity perspective.
- It will be a great opportunity to explore what other universities are doing on sustainability and DEI and connect with people as well as form stronger bonds within the committee.

CSF's collaborators:

- Primary groups work regularly with (e.g. UW solar, UW farm, Resilience lab);
- Secondary work occasionally (e.g. Earth lab, Urban@UW, Clean energy institute)
- Tertiary No/very little engagement of CSF (e.g. Center for Environmental Policy)
- Can find the list of groups on huskylink.washington.edu
- Key terms: ASUW, EC, SAF, OMA&D, RSO, GPSS (details in the CSF partners doc)
- Prior to the next meeting, committee members are encouraged to think of groups that they think CSF should engage with.

Bylaws of the Campus Sustainability Fund:

- Members should go through the bylaws: https://csf.uw.edu/bylaws
- There are 7 articles:
 - 1. The CSF committee
 - 2. The CSF staff
 - 3. Allocation of funds and project selection
 - 4. Project selection and allocation of funds
 - 5. Accountability, records and reports
 - 6. Annual CSF funding
 - 7. Amendment of bylaws

• One of the key components of the funding criteria: Strong preference will be given to projects with a clear, strong student participation component.

Budget for the CSF:

- The budget for 2023 is \$396,604.28 (from state/university funding) and can be seen at https://csf.uw.edu/about-us/how-we-operate/budget
- There is around \$200,000 in restricted funds from STF earmarked for technical projects
- There is \$408,000 in reserved funding, which CSF has full authority over and a part of which can be used for funding new programs
- This year the focus will be on more participatory budgeting

LOIs of projects for review:

- The 5 criteria for judging projects (available in the supported documents folder) are:
 - 1. Sustainable impact
 - 2. Leadership and student involvement
 - 3. Education, outreach and behavioral change
 - 4. Feasibility and accountability
 - 5. Budget
- Two LOIs have been submitted to be considered for full proposal submission:
 - 1. 52nd Spring Powwow from First Nations for \$9078 (they applied for two years in a row and have received funding in the past)
 - 2. Investing stormwater runoff from athletics fields for tire derived anti degradants
- The committee voted and the proposal for the 52nd was passed with 6 votes for yes
- The committee could not vote on the Stormwater runoff proposal during the meeting due to time constraints but were requested to submit the votes by EOD Friday.

Brainstorming session:

- Members are expected to brainstorm on events for next year (solo or with others)
- Committee members are also encouraged to think about one thing they would like to add to the resource guide.
