Projects must improve the sustainability of UW's campus and/or operations. Encompasses social sustainability, environmental sustainability, biodiversity, environmental justice and equity.	Projects must demonstrate some substantial degree of student leadership or student involvement throughout the application and implementation process to be considered for funding. Projects initiated by students will be prioritized.	Projects must include educational and outreach components that help cultivate an aware and engaged campus community.	Applicants must demonstrate appropriate knowledge, timelines, skills, and guidance complete projects successfully. CSF encourages mentor or department support and line item in the budget for project management.	Project must demonstrate a well-researched and feasible budget that accomplishes tasks and appropriately compensates the involved team members along with a timeline to implement the budget

## Non Allowable Uses:

- Funding cannot be used for time and labor expended by UW faculty working unless it is outside the scope of regular faculty duties.
- Funding cannot be used for the purchase of gift cards or other forms of compensation to research subjects. While we encourage compensating research subjects for their time, this must come from another funding source.
- In general, funds cannot be used for food, drinks, or salable merchandise as part of project budgets. Some exceptions may be granted.
- Line-item requests for travel funding are not encouraged, but will be considered on a case by case basis.
- Funds shall not be used for research unless projects include an actionable component.


- Black Student Commission: Sohara wants more clarity on where the money is going, seems like they got all their fundraising already?
- TedX
  - Speakers still don't seem to be defined or really relevant to sustainability
  - Sustainability updates in this round of application feel forced
    - Feels like they were just giving lip service to our comments
  - We don't know if there are lasting educational or behavioral change elements from this
- Little Free Library
  - Cute idea, can see core ethos of the project, bringing people together and community building
  - Idea has been done before and has been successful
  - Environmental things about reducing waste feel like a bit of a far reach
  - Budget might be tight for purchasing books too
  - Good they have already got the project approved from UW Grounds
  - Do they really need to buy books? Doesn't that defeat the purpose?
    - Could have people bring books to the kick off event and trade books and then the leftover ones can stay at the end

## **Proposal presentations**

Investigating stormwater runoff for tire derived anti-degradants from athletic fields

- Alanna PhD student who the primarily applicant
- Background
  - Prespawn coho salmon were dying during urban storm events
  - In 2021, 6PPDQ identified as the causal toxicant (from tires)
    - Really low doses of 6PPDQ are killing salmon
- UW Turf Fields
  - Husky Stadium, Outdoor Training Facilities, and UW Recreation have signed onto the project as stakeholders
  - Waterfront fields which have a lot of turf
  - Water near the fields in Union Bay are migratory habitat for salmon

- Not a lot of people have looked at stormwater runoff for 6PPDQ
- Why CSF?
  - o the unique location of the turf fields near waterways
    - Waterways are rearing and migratory habitat for salmon
  - The presence of a retention basin under Husky Stadium
    - May be treating runoff → need to see if it is an effective solution
  - The opportunity to partner with stakeholders
    - Can develop collaborative and intersectional solutions
    - UW athletics has a lot of sustainability efforts
- Phase I: feasibility study
  - Correct turf infill samples
  - Conduct leaching studies
  - Identify catch basins and outflows from five fields for sampling
  - Conduct a perception study
  - Identify infill alternatives or treatment options to assess in Phase II
  - Raise local awareness of the ecological and societal issues derived from 6PPDQ
- Student involvement
  - Two paid undergraduate researchers
    - One for lab analysis
    - One for perspective studies and stakeholder engagement
  - Graduate student lead (Alanna)
  - Collaborative with UW student groups
    - Athletes for sustainability



#### Questions

- What is your strategy for creating awareness to lead to behavioral change? How do you plan to integrate results from the feasibility study into the next phase?
  - Phase I timeline is shorter
  - Want to present some of the work in related classes on campus, including stormwater classes
  - Contacts with Indigenous communities → don't want to overtax them but know they want to protect salmon
  - second application for Phase II will give opportunity to tweak and develop the project direction
- Minimum wage question? They will update it the updated ask is 20586 (calculated by Boe)

- Specifically looking for funding to be able to do this project
  - Because it is so new lack of funding for this
  - And CSF funding would allow them to do stakeholder engagement too
  - From tatiana: as long as they ensure there are different outputs outside of their thesis + if they are not getting paid to do their thesis only, then it's fine

#### Powwow

- Two days: April 13-14
  - Last year it was just one year
- First Nations undergrad RSO, bringing together Native communities and students
- Powwow gathering of Indigenous people to celebrate and share their cultures
  - Created to reduce animosity between tribes and share their unique cultures
- Impacts
  - Social sustainability
  - Student leadership
  - Cultural education
  - Community building
  - For younger generations, encourages them to come to UW


