Participatory Budgeting Objective

- Overview & process reminder
 - Learned about this in orientation.
 - Participatory budgeting? We like to do within organization. Other forms of budget do it! Like Seattle :-). Individuals as tax payers whom uphold programs should have some say in how money is spent. Application to UW and CSF: We get all of our money from student fees. We want to give an opportunity for agency. CSF staff therefore is not full decider on who shapes CSF budget and how we want to spend those dollars. Conversation in both dollar amount AND how CSF will grow. Budget determines what we can do. If it is not budgeted for, then not doable. Our opinions will be reflected in what CSF asks for from SAF.

Outline of core budget items

- Broken down into 3 categories. So pretty much 2 'play areas'. Today we will reflect how committee has been <3 What desire is for learning more about other CSF programmatic aspects (outside of grant reviewing). And then what are the main priorities of main investment of money.
- o DIFFERENT SECTIONS:
 - Investment & partnerships
 - More in events?
 - Conferences we want to attend?
 - Stipends/honorariums for people working with CSF on volunteer basis
- REVENUE SOURCES: SAF now, in past STF (\$200,000)
- \$220,000 is total we approved for grants. Looking at other streams of funding, such as recouping. So far \$48,000 is coming in. Also putting pressure on STF for \$200,000. We also have a reserve (essentially a savings account).

- Essentially we can comfortably support \$278,000 of grant funding for BOTH cycles.
- SAF always wants to see high investment of grants. When they see a dip in grants (amount we award).
- Money allocated:
 - Large grants
 - Mini grants allocated \$40,000
 - Resilience seed: \$20,000
- \$9000; Programming besides grant making in years past (this is work that a lot of the CSF staff engages with, but committee members can get more involved if this is something we are passionate about):
 - UW sustainability, UW Womens Center, HuES, other group partnerships, Earth Lab, Q Center
 - In spring April, EARTH WEEK (many different programs with different partners)
 - Climate justice conversation around programming. No event this year because no money.
 - Menstruation station and Engender programs; living art museum and goes around binders and story of access to gender affirming care.
 - Events, for example teach-ins. No flexible budget.
 - Conference fees. Don't imagine lots of conference fees. Want to go to professional career.
 - Stipends and honorariums, such as volunteer stipends... Only way to do that is through unpaid labor; such as CELE, volunteer, Capstone students, Zine...
 - CELE and volunteer could help with our marketing (we need marketing and promotions but don't have capacity, so otherwise possibly another undergrad), but capstone and zine are seperate
- Whats up with money from STF? Probably not gonna get, and if we do get it, restrictions!!
- High level thoughts from Julia: Willing to meet next week to not rush through this. Budget itself and reallocating, requires more thinking and talking about broader

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	thoughts about how grant changes allocations. And then future conversations about. And what are partnerships doing that grants aren't? How can we shift our priorities in grant making be retargetting how soliciting and funding grants to target. EXTENSION FOR DEADLINE? Friday 17th. GOALS OF CSF AT LARGE: Not just grants (external) vs other (interal) "Retargetting how we are soliciting grants" Possibly doing themed grant cycles Ways to do teach-ins especially as administration changes.:-) Do round abouts to make this work We need more flexible spending! We are funding a lot of smaller cultural events, weird they are not funded by the school! Getting it started to campaign for them to have money. Lots of money going toward space reservations! Talk to First Nations to see what their process was for the 2 years Every project we fund enters our portfolio. Julia would like to see breakdown of things that are funded since creation to now!! EVERYONE: Think of dream things to fund <3.
