- Answers to concerns
 - 25 volunteers who have expressed willingness, not financially compensated, but the same model as all similar hotlines
 - 20-hour training which is a valuable certification to have
 - Retention has not been an issue for sister orgs
 - Have support systems in place for volunteers
 - Phase 1 right now
 - Included with a broad range of legal stakeholders with whom they plan to stay in contact with
 - Don't foresee issues with UW after speaking to them
 - Volunteer positions are sought after and they will likely have to be denied
 - Plan is to apply for state funding (to pay volunteers) after pilot
 - State budget is ROUGH
- Feel more comfortable with voting now, especially around retention
- **Zoorhkhaneh- DO NOT VOTE FOR THIS RN**
 - Live scoring
 - main concerns are with budget
 - retroactively paying? Probably not an issue because its a stipend
 - accomadations
 - we have explicitly refused to fund accommodations for other groups doing similar events, don;t want to be unfair
 - on other hand, is the project feasible without it?
 - good that they are applying for other sources
 - maybe ask what that funding is going to
 - will people have to buy tickets to attend this? Most likely no but should ask, if so how much are the tickets?
 - emmy nominated filmmaker vs hiring a student instead, as cool as it is
 - instructor we feel comfortable with, musicians are iffy
 - also accomodations could change based on when they look at it? They already booked it we think? So that should be fine
