- Could you elaborate on your outreach plan?
 - We plan to promote this through all CIRCLE channels, including social media (Instagram and messaging apps), the newsletter sent to all international students, and relevant departmental listservs (e.g., advisers' listserv). We will also collaborate with relevant RSOs like, Malaysian Student Association (malaysia@uw.edu, @masa_udub), South Asian Student Association (sasauw@uw.edu, @sasauw), Chinese Scholar Student Association (cssa@uw.edu, @cssauw), and Arab Student Association (arabsa@uw.edu, @asa.uw). We will also post flyers across campus to increase visibility and participation.
- Does CIRCLE have any other sources of funding?
 - CIRCLE will provide snacks and refreshments for each workshop. Please note that SAB is not a registered RSO.
- For the three stipends, are those people already established in the group, or are they being actively recruited?
 - The project lead will remain the same next year. SAB is currently recruiting new members, and two will be selected to support this project.
- How many hours will the three positions (paid the \$800 stipend) work on the project?
 - Every stipend member will put in approximately 40-50 hours of work throughout the project's implementation period.
- Have you looked into free printing through the RSO center for the flyers?
 - Since SAB is not an RSO, we are not eligible for free printing through the RSO Center. We have revised the budget to remove printing costs, as CIRCLE will cover this expense.
- For reusable facilitation kits, please give more details of exact amounts with links.
 - The specific components and quantities are currently being finalized as the planning of workshops is still underway. The kits are intended to include low-wate, reusable materials such as markers, sticky notes and pens etc.
